





Project Browser

- Quality metrics introduced
- Understand which modules are best suited to your needs








Automatic Updates

- Schedule automatic security updates
- Update patch versions and even minor versions automatically
- Save time for your engineering team so they can focus on features





Recipes Starter Templates

- Built on the previous "distributions" framework
- Mix and match packages of modules and features together
- Get a jump start on your Drupal project


















Timeline

- The features of Drupal 11 are being built in Drupal 10.
- If you stay up to date with 10.1, 10.2,10.3, etc. – you will receive powerful feature updates every 6 months.
- Drupal 11 will mark the moment when major underlying libraries receive updates, and when deprecated code is removed.
- Drupal 11 is targeted for August 2024, with a December 2024 fallback

Guidelines

New major releases only include:


- 1. Increasing PHP and system requirements
- 2. Upgrading dependencies to new major releases
- 3. Removing code deprecated during the previous major development cycle.

All other changes should be backwards-compatible with the final scheduled minor release of the previous major version.
