- Drupal is a very flexible and robust system; there are many different ways to build Drupal to fit many different use cases.
- The drawback is that it also opens the door for poorly planned implementations that can impede the effectiveness of your team.
- The good news: Drupal can be implemented to meet the needs of your team and empower efficient workflows!





Simplifying the Editing Experience



Best Practices

- Provide a unified editing location.
- Organize areas of the page on the backend to map to their frontend counterparts; think table of contents.
- Use the power of Drupal's backend and the site's frontend to simplify what is required for users to enter to build a page.
- Be mindful of where flexibility makes sense, and where a more rigid approach might be more appropriate.
- Provide supporting documentation that covers how to use the system from a functional perspective, and also from a content strategy perspective.







User Documentation (cont.)

Landing page - reorderable components

Content element	Recommended use
Card section	Provide brief snippets of information and clear pathways to related content. Each card has a title, optional link, and brief description. Cards grouped together in a section should have a clear connection, which is conveyed through the card section title and intro.
Checkerboard	Provide related info, with optional link; use one or stack multiple. Stick to one subject per checkerboard.
Promo block	Use to present multiple clear calls-to-action under one heading and brief description.
Plan summary	Table to present multiple pans with quick, scannable presentation of key info (primary care physician required, out of network coverage, and PDF download for plan details).
Plan summary feature	Brief description of a single plan, focusing on key benefits for members. In a sentence or two, why should I pick this plan over the others?



The power of automation and content reuse



Best Practices

- Use typeahead fields to manually curate the existing content you want to pull in.
- Leverage taxonomy and views to enrich pages with related content automatically.
- Cut down on user error and effort by having a canonical content source.
- Create listings with full featured filtering capabilities.
- Leverage existing data sources by integrating them with Drupal.



Best Practices


- Streamline what can be accessed, and don't confuse users with options they don't need.
- Provide dashboards to easily find relevant resources and tasks.
- Be mindful of overly complex roles and permissions structures, and leverage the practices of your organization to fill in gaps.







Website Roles and Permissions

- Keep these high-level, think in terms of trust and ability
- Exceptions are okay, but should not be the norm
 - Try to avoid responsibility-triage using the system, when it can be addressed offline
- Segment users into "Groups" to manage particular sections of the site to allow for nuance.





Final Thoughts

- Drupal is a complex system with many different use cases.
- It takes a lot of thought and planning to build an effective and easy-to-use Drupal site.
- When built right, it can empower your team and make their lives easier:
 - Keep the editing experience simple and streamlined
 - Build in flexibility responsibly so users have the tools they need
 - Allow for content reuse whenever possible to reduce user error and effort
 - Integrate with data sources
 - o Tailor the administration experience to the user's role
